In the weeks since Russia first invaded Ukraine, **KSE transformed from a premier business and economics institution to an unlikely emergency aid powerhouse**, tapping its networks to fundraise, supply, and help distribute tens of thousands of humanitarian aid kits. With that supply chain established, it becomes a matter of scale – and funds to scale.

KSE Charitable Foundation is de jure two foundations, one registered in the US, 501.c.3, and another in Ukraine.


Ukrainian-based KSE Charitable Foundation was established in 2007 as a subsidiary of its non-profit corporation in the United States. Originally, with a focus on providing scholarships for it's students. Once the full-scale Russian invasion started KSE Foundation and Ukrainian businesses and state-owned companies have launched a humanitarian aid campaign for Ukraine. It operates all defence- and battlefield-related projects. It is a legal campaign face.

The US foundation has more than 20 years of experience and has a track record of humanitarian relief efforts in the 1990s, 2004, 2013-2016, and now in 2022. It is focused on the medical and humanitarian directions. It is a vehicle for obtaining substantial grants from international companies and foundations.

We prioritized:

Areas of humanitarian aid

KSE Charitable Foundations launched a humanitarian aid campaign to support Ukrainians shield from Russian aggression

Medical assistance



- 1. Our goal is to provide 307 000 first aid kits for the seriously injured, which is 10% of all the needs of the Ministry of Health
- 2. We help to purchase and deliver armored cars for para-medics on the battlefield

1 kit – \$100 1 car – \$7,000

Relief for war-affected cities



- 1. Mobile medical center will travel to the liberated cities in the Kyiv region and provide medical care to residents.
- 2. Hospital reconstruction in the Kyiv region (Bucha), in cooperation with Forbes Ukraine

Military assistance



Vests, helmets, armored cars and special techniques for defenders.

We also deliver plates, drones and other supplies via volunteers.

Appendix 1: Vests, helmets and first aid kits

Summary

In order to secure the assault units of the Ukrainian armed forces intended for the liberation of the temporarily occupied territories, KSE has signed a contract for 5,000 sets (2 plates, helmet and plate carrier) with expected delivery in the first half of May.

For delivery of this order is required additionally \$1.9M for financing 2,800 sets. KSE has already raised \$ 1.5M to secure the delivery (2,200 sets).



Motivation for financing

- Guaranteed quality: NATO certified manufacturer
- Competitive price: \$ 677 per set (2 plates, helmet and plate carrier)
- Signed contract for delivery: the first half of May
- Complete set with all required units for the combat brigade

Detail description





Quantity

Total contract for 5,000 sets, presupposing:

- 2,800 sets require finding
- 2,200 kits have already been redeemed with guaranteed delivery

Price

- \$ 1.9 M is needed to buy 2,800 sets, the total contract value is \$ 3.4 M
- Price per set \$677 (~40% below the market price 1)

Beginning of May with the possibility of delivery in parts

The KSE foundation is working on sourcing 30k of 3 critical components for the Ministry of Health to include in first aid kits:


- 1. Tourniquets
- 2. Israeli bandages
- 3. Hemostatic bandages

We secured supply of medical components with a **total cost of \$1.3m** that require funding support and will come ASAP in batches over the next 4-5 weeks

1. Tourniquets

- Ukrainian producer "Sich Ukraine" (1k per week)
- US producer "Safeguard Medical" (5k per week)
- South African Be Safe Paramedical (5k per week)

\$830k / 30k units



2. Israeli bandages

"Hartman International" (30k available immediately)

\$206k / 30k units



3. Hemostatic bandage

 Ukrainian producer "Senta Farm" (5-10k per week)

\$254k / 30k units



All components have been tested and approved by the Ministry of Health

Appendix 2: Mobile medical center



The terrible consequences of the Russian occupation, Irpin, and other cities of the Kyiv region are the real faces of the occupiers. Marauders, murderers, and rapists left behind ruins, mutilated people, bombed homes, and mountains of rubbish.

To take care of the survivors, the teams of the **KSE Foundation** and the **Medical Network «Dobrobut»** are raising funds to open a mobile health center.

A free medical center is already operating in Irpin



Seeds for Ukraine

Situation:

Because of Russian aggression, most supply chains and logistics are broken in Ukraine. Work of Ukrainian farmers is <u>under constant</u> danger. This creates <u>huge risks for global food security</u>, as well as for local communities.

Project process:

After receiving parcels with seeds, our logistics partner Nova Poshta will deliver them to the humanitarian warehouse in Ivano-Frankivsk, Ukraine.

Volunteers will help the project team to sort the seeds and pack them into the "family kits" (15-20 packs each) depending on the region.

With our partners from the initiative "Victory Gardens" we will **ship the seeds directly to communities** from the areas, affected by war.

KSE researchers will measure the impact of the initiative

Our goal is to deliver seed kits to more than 100,000 families during this spring season.
