JULY: REINTEGRATION OF WAR VETERANS AND AEROMEDICAL RESCUE

With your support, we can not only work towards victory, but also care for those who defend the values of the civilized world on the front lines and who have been most affected by the Russian invasion.

In July, we announced the start of a higher education scholarship program for war veterans, defenders of the country and their children, children of IDPs, and talented graduates. This academic year, 700 entrants will receive scholarships to study at KSE.

We offer not only grants for training, but also community that will be supportive and understanding, that will provide veterans a new meaning for moving on. We offer grants to every military man who wants to continue the protection of Ukraine in the economic plane, get the best education in Ukraine and build the new economy.

This program is a part of comprehensive measures to support veterans returning to civilian life. This month, we took another important step in this direction: the Ministry of Economy of Ukraine, KSE Graduate Business School and KSE Foundation joined forces and signed a memorandum of cooperation to support veterans in the development and implementation of effective business plans.

War veterans and their families can receive state grants of up to 1 million UAH to start or develop their own business - KSE Graduate Business School, a leading business school in Ukraine and Europe, will support them in developing an effective business plan, and the KSE Foundation will finance services from consulting.

But it is impossible to talk about the return of wounded soldiers to civilian life without prioritizing their rescue on the battlefield. In July, students of the Kyiv School of Economics launched an incredibly ambitious initiative "Donate To Evacuate" to purchase medical evacuation helicopters to rescue soldiers on the front lines. This is the first time that the student community responded to such a significant request of the Main Directorate of Intelligence of Ukraine. The KSE Foundation team together with the Charitable Fund for the Development of Defense Capability of Ukraine are happy to support them in this goal.

In early July, the \$1 million goal set by KSE students to purchase two evacuation helicopters seemed out of reach. Summing up this month, we state that the original goal was exceeded by more than two times! Thanks to Ukrainian business, thousands of private benefactors, and the incredible Kateryna Khanшukova, a soloist of the English National Ballet, who initiated a charity ballet evening at the National Opera "The Art of Donations. Inspired by ballet", to every guest of the event and, of course, to the perseverance of our students, more than 2.1 million dollars were collected for the purchase of medevac helicopters, for special rescue operations for the Main Directorate of Intelligence of Ukraine of the Ministry of Defense of Ukraine and educational scholarships.



Also in July we:

- Continued to provide brigades with DJI Mavic reconnaissance drones. Over the past year and a half, we have established a system of international purchases and sent hundreds of drones to the front line.
- Invested in comprehensive training in military technologies of war for effective use of equipment and saving lives.
- Received feedback about the saved lives of the smallest Ukrainians and assistance to hundreds of newborns thanks to the transferred to the Kropyvnytskyi Maternity Hospital medical devices and reagents.
- We continued to arrange shelters in schools and kindergartens of Ukraine within the framework of "ZAKHYSTOK: Safe Education" program for thousands of Ukrainian children.
- We continue to provide development grants to creative Ukrainians within the framework of the "Talents for Ukraine" program. This month, many talented people received grants, including a chronic pain researcher, the author of an innovative project on the humane decontamination of mistletoe using drones, a creative producer of documentaries about Ukraine's victories in the war, a co-founder and host of an educational YouTube channel about psychology and relationships.

We thank all our partners and benefactors for their trust and opportunity not only to save lives, but also to relentlessly invest in the development of human capital, innovation and science.


