JANUARY: SAVING THE WOUNDED AND INVESTING IN ADVANCED EDUCATION

Dear partners, friends, and benefactors,

In the nearly two years since the full-scale war began, your contributions have saved hundreds of thousands of lives. This month, we successfully raised almost \$657,000 in support of Ukraine. Each contribution in January has continued to lay the groundwork for the future of the Ukrainian people – saving lives, restoring the right to education, and inspiring the youth to stay in their homeland.

We began the year by concentrating on reinforcing our ongoing initiatives, specifically:

Institutional Development

The "Donate to Educate" project, aimed at accumulating scholarship funds for youth affected by the war, welcomed 488 donors. Together, we raised \$1,355,198! To achieve our goal, we need to secure an additional \$644,802. This funding will enable us to provide scholarships to 400 new students in the upcoming academic year.

• Humanitarian Initiatives:

The "Donate to Evacuate" initiative, led by students from the KSE University, continues to grow. This month, we transfered another helicopter for medical evacuation to the Main Directorate of Intelligence of the Ministry of Defense of Ukraine as part of this initiative. Thanks to the contribution from the Olena Zelenska Foundation, this upgraded helicopter, now equipped with medical devices, is operational in front-line regions. It plays a crucial role in the rapid aeromedical evacuation of combat-wounded individuals.

The MI-2 MSB-1 helicopter has been upgraded with the necessary medical equipment. The onboard medical devices are provided by the leading global manufacturer, the Swiss company Weinmann, while Garmin supplies the navigation equipment. The helicopter has the capacity to transport three wounded individuals simultaneously and is designed to land in extremely challenging conditions inaccessible to other vehicles.



- In January, your support enabled an additional 700 children to return from distance learning back to full-time, in-person classes.. Thanks to the "ZAKHYSTOK: Safe Education" project, thousands of schoolchildren and preschoolers across Ukraine have been able to return to their desks – your contributions made this possible. More than \$90,000 was allocated to the repair of school shelters in January.

Shepetivka Educational Complex



Khmelnytskyi region, Shepetivka



The building of the educational institution was originally constructed in 1975.he basement was not suitable for use as a shelter, as the height of the space failed to meet the standards set by the State Emergency Service. Additionally, the lack of ventilation meant that using the space as a shelter could pose a risk to children.

In the shelter, electrical systems were updated, and new lighting, ventilation, and fire doors were installed. To increase the height of the space and make it compliant with safety standards, soil was excavated. he issue of water infiltration into the shelter was resolved. For comfort, soft benches and bright poufs were added, creating a more welcoming environment.

Support for Ukraine's Defenders

In January, over \$66,000 in targeted donations from benefactors were directed towards the purchase of reconnaissance drones, night vision devices, generators, communication tools, as well as for vehicle maintenance services for the Defenders. Nearly \$275,000 was allocated for assistance in fulfilling defense tasks and social support. More than \$315,000 were aimed at supporting the development of innovations.

Talent and Education Development

Another participant of the "Veteran Business: From Idea to Financing" program received a state grant of 250,000 UAH after consulting with the KSE Graduate Business School – he will be developing a startup focused on plant protection using agrodrones. Additionally, there were 16 business consultations provided in January.

As we approach the two-year anniversary of the war next month, it's clear that our resilience is a direct result of your support. Together, we are strong, and with you by our side, we will prevail. Thank you!
