MARCH: INVESTMENTS IN EDUCATION QUALITY

In March, with your support, we expanded our educational assistance programs amidst the war. According to Ukraine's Ministry of Education and Science, more than 868,000 Ukrainian children are still forced to study online. The KSE Foundation team is actively working to equip shelters as part of our national initiative, "ZAKHYSTOK: Safe Education," to reinstate their right to in-person learning. Despite the challenges posed by the war, we are forming international partnerships to improve the quality of remote education. We have started to invest in providing top-tier STEM education in Ukrainian. Additionally, we remain committed to enhancing resilience and providing support to our communities.

This month:

- The KSE Foundation has forged a partnership with Khan Academy, a leader in global education, by signing a memorandum of cooperation. This collaboration will enable hundreds of thousands of students to access high-quality online lessons in Ukrainian, spanning various precise disciplines. We encourage support for the translation and localization of these STEM lessons ✨
- Additionally, over 1,110 students have resumed in-person learning as part of the nationwide "ZAKHYSTOK: Safe Education" initiative. We have successfully equipped four additional shelters. Since launching this program in 2022, thanks to your generous donations, we have impacted over 25,000 schoolchildren and preschoolers. You have helped provide them with the opportunity to learn among peers, rather than isolated in front of computer screens.

- Three participants from the KSE Graduate Business School, who are veterans and their family members, received government grants of approximately \$13,000 each after consultations at the business school. These consultations were made possible by your generous contributions.
- Students from KSE University organized the KSE Meeting Auction, a charity event where a hundred members of the Kyiv School of Economics community participated. This initiative was led by students benefiting from the scholarship program at the Kyiv School of Economics, funded by your donations. They successfully raised funds for three reconnaissance drones and additional batteries for Ukraine's defenders. Among the auction lots were meetings with Oleksandra Matviichuk, head of the Civil Liberties Center, 2022 Nobel Peace Prize, and "Talents for Ukraine" awardee; Tymofiy Mylovanov, President of the Kyiv School of Economics; Thomas Barrett, instructor of the History of Economic Ideas course at Kyiv School of Economics and an Oxford University graduate; and others.
- In further exciting news, Mstyslav Chernov and Evgeniy Maloletka, awardees of the first stage of the "Talents for Ukraine" grant program and authors of the film "20 Days in Mariupol," received an Oscar. Additionally, 12 talented Ukrainians were announced as awardees of the second stage of the program, including physics teacher Khrystyna Gnatenko, Burning Man festival sculpture artist Oleksiy Sai, and astrophysicist Olena Kompaniiets.

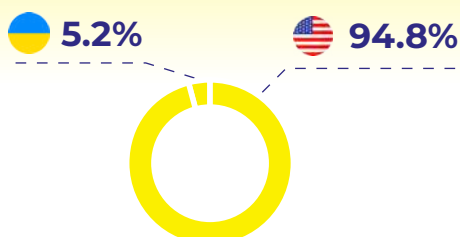

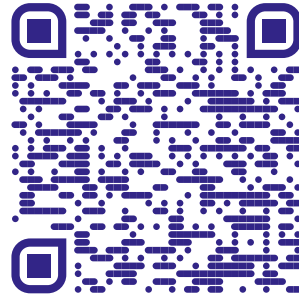

ZAKHYSTOK: Safe Education

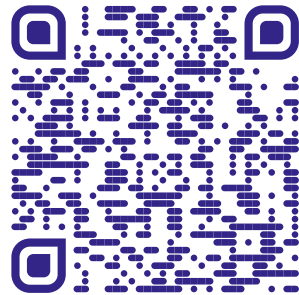
A project focused on equipping shelters in educational institutions across Ukraine. Our goal is to return as many Ukrainian children to offline lessons as possible

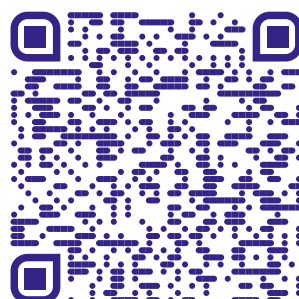
The project aims to fund scholarships for 400 new students: youth who have lost their homes due to war, veterans, and children of fallen Defenders
