This month, in addition to our ongoing projects, we focused on selecting tomorrow's change-makers. Representatives of the KSE Foundation joined the KSE University grant committee to provide talented young people, heavily impacted by the war, the chance to receive a high-quality education in Ukraine — made possible by your support.

Together with the Ministry of Economy of Ukraine and our international partners, we also organized competitive interviews for Ukrainians eager to return from abroad and drive meaningful change in public service.

With your continued support, we were able to invest in strengthening Ukraine's Defense Forces, protecting children, and fostering the growth of small and medium-sized businesses run by Ukrainian women.



In August:

- We provided 14 reconnaissance drones, communication equipment, and military gear to our defenders on the Zaporizhzhia, Kharkiv, and Donetsk fronts. Near the city of Orikhiv in Zaporizhzhia, russian forces continue daily assaults. In Vovchansk, Kharkiv region, the occupiers have resumed offensive operations, just as they have near Chasiv Yar. On all these fronts, Ukrainian soldiers are defending the values of the free world, and it's our responsibility to equip them with what they need to safeguard their lives and mount an effective defense.
- Through the "Create Ukraine" program, we received dozens of applications from Ukrainians eager to return from abroad, bringing valuable international experience to aid in Ukraine's development. These are professionals with impressive careers at global companies like the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank to Estee Lauder and Deloitte. Their motivation to return and work with the Ministry of Economy to address the challenges of the war is truly inspiring. With the support of the Central Project Management Agency, the EU, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Lithuania, and the Ministry of Economy of Ukraine, we are proud to offer them the resources to turn their ideas into action.

 We also brought together an exceptionally talented, ambitious, and diverse group — the winners of our Talents for Ukraine program, now in its second year. These change-makers — inventors, scientists, musicians, physicists, robotics experts, and teachers — are working together to create a foundation for future collaboration. Already, we are seeing the remarkable initiatives they are launching as a team.



Hundreds of applicants applied for grants to study at KSE University. Thanks to your support, 423 of them have received the opportunity to high-quality pursue а education, free of charge, in fields they are passionate about. Kyiv School of Economics offers these students an excellent alternative to studying abroad, with European standards of education and teaching methods.





• We awarded grants to 20 Ukrainian women to grow their manufacturing businesses through the "CREATE!" program. This funding supports ventures like automating a cheese factory, expanding into foundry production with a milling machine, and enhancing a family bakery with new equipment. This grant program is run in collaboration with the Ministry of Economy and UMAEF, with compliance overseen by the Oschadbank team.

1,808 more children now have access to shelters

In August, we completed five shelters in Ukrainian schools and began three more. One shelter, at Nizhyn Gymnasium in Chernihiv, now serves 800 students with dedicated areas for learning, play, reading, and psychological support. Thanks to the Olena Zelenska Foundation, we installed an inclusive shelter with wheelchair-accessible facilities and a generator to ensure continuous operation.


